Sa bhliain 1634 rinne parlaimint cíollíneach na hÉireann dlí úr i gcoinne na sodamachta - an chéad agus an t-aon dlí mar sin a rinneadh anseo in Éirinn, riamh. Roimhe sin bhí Éire Gaelach i bhfad níos báula ó thaobh an homaighnéasaigh de. Sa chaint dhátheangach seo (le sleamhnán) beidh Brian ag plé stair an homaighnéasaigh agus an t-aiteacht in Éire Gaelach ó thíos na haimsire stáiriúla, ag tosnú le Naomh Pádraig agus teacht na Críostaíochta síos go dtí deireadh na ré gaelait ag túis an seachtú haois déag. Beidh scéaltaí fá choinne rudaí mar sin á lua ag Brian ó na sean-lámhscribhínní: na dlíthe breithiúna, na téacsanna cráifeacha - mar shampla beathaí na naoimh agus dlíthe na heaglaise, agus dántaí na bhfilí Gaelacha ina measc.

In 1634 the colonial Irish parliament passed a law against sodomy. It was the first and only such law (criminalising homosexuality and queer behaviour) ever enacted in Ireland. Gaelic Ireland had been a lot more relaxed about such matters. In this illustrated, bilingual talk Brian will be looking at the history of homosexuality and queerness in Ireland from the beginning of the historic period with the arrival of St Patrick and Christianity down to the end of Gaelic Ireland at the beginning of the 17th century. Brian will refer to stories in the ancient manuscripts about such matters in a variety of old texts such as the Brehon Laws, religious writing - for example the saints' Lives and church laws, and the homoerotic poetry of the Gaelic bards.

Brian Lacey, an archaeologist and historian of early medieval Ireland, is the author of the book: ‘Terrible Queer Creatures: homosexuality in Irish history’. He was a gay activist in Derry in the 1970s, 80s and 90s.



Rugadh Micí sa bhliain 1865, bhí dhá chloigeann déag ina chlann agus ba é fein an duine ba shine sa teaghlaich. D'fhág Mac Gabhann Doire Chonaire nuair a bhí sé ina fhear óg, d'oibrigh sé ar fud Mheiriceá sular thug sé aghaidh ar Yukon i dtóraíocht an óir.

Levels: All levels of experience and ability welcome.

Join poet Annemarie Ní Churreáin for a workshop exploring the art and craft of writing poetry. In an encouraging and supportive environment, participants will learn to identify resonant poetry themes, gaining insights into the making of a poem. In this workshop we'll look at how and where a poem begins and how we can get a first draft onto the page. Workshop exercises will include creative writing prompts, close reading of work by established poets, and group discussion.

This workshop will take place in the former home of Micí Mac Gabhann, the author of Rotha Mor an tSaoil (The Hard Road to Klondike). Born in 1865, the eldest of twelve children, Mac Gabhann left DerryConnor as a young man and eventually worked his way across America, before embarking on the gold rush in the Yukon.

Seán Ó Baoil


